• IICRA Introduction :

International Islamic Centre for Reconciliation and Arbitration (IICRA) is an international, independent, non-profit organization which was established in 2005 based on the International Convention to become one of the infrastructure institutions of the Islamic economy as well as one of its kind hosted in Dubai by the United Arab Emirates (UAE). IICRA, through its activity, aims at enabling all dealers whether they are individual or corporate bodies to settle their financial, commercial, banking, investment, real estate, and other disputes through institutional reconciliation and arbitration with compliance of Shari'ah Provisions.

• Objective

The program's objective is to promote the culture of arbitration and train the arbitrators and experts to be well-versed and familiar with the best practices of international commercial arbitration and the UAE Arbitration Law No. (6) of 2018, as well as understand Islamic banks and their main products and services comprehensively. The program focusses on legislation and legal frameworks regulating Islamic financial transactions, especially Chapter Six of Federal Law No. 50 of 2022 regarding commercial transactions in the United Arab Emirates (UAE).

• Course Outline

The program consists of a series of topics where the expected timeline for delivery of each topic is expected to be in four (4) sessions, each approximately two (2) hours. The program has been designed to deliver information gradually so that each trainee must complete the previous module before moving on to the next module. The topics are as follows:
